- 2. What are the welfare benefits and adverse welfare effects of high concentration CO₂ stunning of pigs and the potential alternatives?
- 3. What back up methods of stunning are available?
- 4. What stunning methods are used for cull sows and boars?

Commercial questions for industry:

- 5. What are the commercial benefits and challenges of high concentration CO₂ stunning of pigs and the potential alternatives?
- 6. What is the hourly throughput necessary for viability and how is this affected by different stunning methods?
- 7. What would be the capital investment required to implement alternative stunning methods for pigs?
- 8. What would be the maintenance and running costs of alternative stunning methods compared to high concentration CO₂ stunning, including gas and electricity costs?
